Arizon® Companies construct Russian Federation Air Structures

Russian Unity Party holds meeting at Arizon Structure in Novagorsk

Moscow, Russian Federation—Chairman Ron Scharf, Vice President of Engineering, Tom Soehngen and other company representatives attended the Grand Opening of the Russian Federation National Guard Academy near Moscow. This nearly 90' tall multi-sports facility, made of Arizon's proprietary fabric membrane, was manufactured by the Arizon Companies of St. Louis, Missouri, USA. The Academy's exterior fabric membrane was manufactured in Arizon's Miami, Florida, manufacturing facility, and other mechanical components were manufactured in Arizon's St. Louis, Missouri manufacturing facilities. The Academy is 210' x 294', and its height is 75' on top of a nearly 15' knee wall, a total of nearly 90' in height. It includes an ice and hockey rink, soccer field, basketball gymnasium, tennis courts, gymnastics and weight training areas along with locker rooms and administrative offices. The Academy was erected under the supervision of Scott Manuel, an Arizon executive.

During Scharf and Soehngen's visit, the Russian Unity Party held its annual meeting at the Academy. The Arizon Facility received the Party's endorsement during the presentation of the Unity Party's Political Platform, which consisted of a promise to the Russian people to deliver hundreds of similar sports facilities throughout the Russian Federation. The Russian Premier, along with the President of the Russian Duma (Congress) and the Minister of Emergency Situations (National Guard, FEMA and Civil Defense) praised the Arizon Multi Sports Facility. A special appearance was made by famous Olympic figure skaters who demonstrated on the Academy's ice arena, and the Minister of Russian Sports, ex-Detroit Red Wing and NHL Hall of Fame member, Fetisov. For all NHL Hockey fans, Minister Fetisov was a member of the world-famous "Russian Five Line" during the Red Wing's glory years.

The Arizon Companies have also recently manufactured or installed air structures in other parts of the Russian Federation. The Russian Ministry of Emergency Situations sponsored a Multi Sports Facility in

Nikola, along the shores of Lake Bycal, the deepest lake in the world. The Arizon Companies and its local representative office, was selected to supervise the installation of this air structure, manufactured by others. Arizon manufactured and installed the mechanical, heating, inflation and related equipment to operate this building.

One of Russia's largest oil, gas and petroleum companies, Gasprom, also purchased an Arizon Air Structure for use as an equipment storage and warehouse facility for its operations in Siberia, on the Yamal Peninsula. Gasprom ADR's (American Depository Receipts) are traded on the New York Stock Exchange under the symbol OGZPY.

A Russian Bank, the Sovcom Bank, also purchased two identical Arizon Structures, 118' x 279' x 36' tall, for use as part of a nationwide tennis chain intended for the bank's customers and the general public.
